Are you trying to get your driver's license restored?

- Have you lost your license due to an alcohol or drug related offense?
- Has the Secretary of State sent you a letter saying that you are eligible to file an appeal to get your license re-instated?
- Are you ready to get the process started?

The Secretary of State requires that every person filing an appeal with the DAAD (Driver's Assessment & Appeal Division) must first obtain a substance abuse evaluation.

What Will Happen During the Evaluation

This one time evaluation consists of a one hour meeting with a Licensed Masters Level clinician. The clinician will discuss your current and past use of alcohol and other drugs, as well as the information contained in the documents that you bring to the evaluation.

Required Documents

Please bring copies of all of the required documents (drug screen results, notarized letters of support, master driving record, etc.) with you to your appointment. The Secretary of State will need your original documents and we will need to keep copies of your records on file. We will review with you the full list of documents needed when you call to schedule an appointment.

Do you need to get a substance abuse assessment for court?

- Has the court mandated that you obtain a substance abuse assessment?
- Have you been charged with a Minor In Possession (MIP) or possession of drugs?
- Has your lawyer recommended that you obtain a substance abuse assessment before you go to court?

The judicial system often orders individuals to obtain a substance abuse assessment in order to help determine the need for substance abuse treatment and provide additional information that may help them with sentencing.

What Will Happen During the Evaluation

Your visit will consist of a one hour assessment that will assess your need for services based on your current and past use of drugs and alcohol. At this time, the clinician will determine if any substance abuse treatment or education is necessary. If you choose to accept the referral, the clinician will help you coordinate treatment through your insurance, or with affordable agencies within the community. You can also choose to coordinate services on your own.



Are you trying to restore your commercial driver's license?

- Is your commercial driver's license restricted due to testing positive for alcohol or drugs?
- Has your employer requested that you set up an appointment with a Substance Abuse Professional (SAP)?
- Are you ready to get the process started?

Any person that holds a commercial driver's license and tests positive for alcohol or drugs is required to obtain an evaluation from a licensed Substance Abuse Professional (SAP).

Please be aware that we will need to know what substance(s) you tested positive for at the time your initial appointment is set.

What Will Happen During the Evaluation

Your first visit will consist of a one hour evaluation that will assess your current and past use of substances. At this time, the SAP will determine if any substance abuse treatment or education is necessary, and will help coordinate this through your insurance, or with affordable agencies within the community. Be aware that the SAP will order random drug screens throughout the process at an additional cost to you.

At your follow-up visits, the SAP will evaluate your compliance with their recommendations. The SAP will determine whether or not they will refer you for a return to duty drug screen with your employer or if additional requirements will be ordered.

After your final visit, we will send the appropriate documentation to your employer.
